

It is not the <u>poor people</u> who are to blame for climate change, but it is poor people who are suffering first and <u>most</u> from it. Therefore, we the people must come together to take action to defend each other:

DISRUPT THE STATUS QUO

- Uplift youth leadership and the leadership of frontline communities.
- Work with First Nations to protect their <u>treaty rights</u> and <u>food</u> <u>sovereignty</u>.
- Blockade all fossil fuel <u>extraction</u>, <u>infrastructure</u>, <u>shipping</u> and <u>export</u>.
- Reduce <u>meat, fish, and dairy</u> consumption that comes from industrial agriculture.
- Expose any elected official who does not take the fossil fuel integrity <u>pledge</u>.
- <u>Divest</u> yourself, and your <u>church/university/town/city/state/banks</u> from fossil fuel money.

FOOD, WATER & HOUSING FOR ALL

- Reduce dependence on industrial agriculture by growing food in every neighborhood.
- Catch and <u>treat rainwater</u> for household use.
- Take <u>direct action</u> to protect all water bodies from pollution and <u>clean</u> them.
- Work together in <u>communities</u> to <u>affordably build</u> and retrofit housing to follow the six principles of <u>radically sustainable housing</u>.

REDUCE ENERGY CONSUMPTION

- Work together in communities to create <u>solar</u> and <u>wind</u> powered grids.
- <u>Urge local elected officials</u> to create <u>affordable</u> mass transit systems and <u>bike lanes</u> in small towns as well as large cities.
- Reduce dependency on extractive corporations by only <u>buying</u> <u>what you need</u>.
- Share tools, clothes, appliances, housing and cars to help each other.
- Create collectives within your community to teach <u>skills</u> such as <u>building</u>, <u>permaculture</u>, <u>plant-based cooking</u>, etc.

RESTORATIVE WORK

- Restore the land with indigenous <u>trees</u>, <u>plants</u>, <u>animal species</u>, <u>and</u> <u>medicines</u>.
- Be in solidarity with the First Nations and learn from them how to <u>manage ecosystems</u>.
- Support the transition of <u>fossil fuel workers</u> to clean healthy living wage jobs based in local sustainable economy and community.
- Urge elected officials to <u>legalize hemp</u> for food, building materials, medicine.
- Learn and implement the <u>local</u> restorative <u>solutions from Global</u> <u>South communities</u> who are doing so much for climate justice.

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
